

ADVANCED EVIDENCE (JS 617)

This course is a must for judges who want to improve their evidentiary rulings. The expert faculty will review recent cases that impact evidentiary rulings, address problematic areas under the Federal Rules of Evidence, and explore the impact of these on evidentiary issues in state courts. PREREQUISITE: A law degree or completion of one of the following courses is required to attend: Fundamentals of Evidence (or its equivalent), Special Court Jurisdiction, or Special Court Jurisdiction: Advanced.

- 1. Ensure that baseline relevancy issues are met to ensure the probative value outweighs unfair prejudice;
- 2. Outline an analytical scheme for ruling on hearsay objections and the exceptions;
- 3. Effectively handle Confrontation and Crawford issues;
- 4. Analyze when character evidence and prior bad acts are admissible;
- 5. Confidently rule on issues relating to lay and expert opinion testimony;
