- 1. opinion writing;
- 2. small group dynamics and collaborative decision-making;
- 3. how to get the most during oral argument;
- 4. civility and professionalism;
- 5. ethics issues pertinent to the appellate bench;
- 6. judicial deference to executive branch agency decisions;
- 7. trends in judicial security;
- 8. a re-examination of the death penalty 50 years after *Furman v. Georgia*;
